East Java

Our child and family sponsorship programs support two precious communities in East Java where children are at a high risk for being trafficked. Grace House our second aftercare shelter, is also in this region.

Where We Work

Bali

Bali is an international child sex tourism destination. We partner with other organizations an are establishing our own office in Bali to support law enforcement, caregivers, and partnered rescues.

North Sulawesi

Sarah's House is our shelter for trafficking survivors in North Sulawesi. The shelter, combined with law enforcement partnerships, has sustainably reduced afficking in this region. We also have a Transition Home or survivors preparing for a more independent lifestyle.

Indonesia is one of the largest child sex tourism destinations in the world and has a population of **258 million**. We are one of only a few anti-trafficking organizations operating within the country.


A Year of Resilience

Sarah's House

Residents discovered new ways to do school, be active, and live quarantined for most of 2020. Staff supported each resident in creative and sensitive ways so that the challenges of quarantining and separation from family didn't prevent their ongoing healing from trafficking. With extended grace, we helped one another move forward in a time when most things felt like they were falling apart. Beauty truly does come from ashes.



A Gear of Rebuilding

A key pillar of our operations in Indonesia is sustained partnership with local law enforcement and prosecutorial offices. We do this through police conferencing and seminars. Prior to the Covid-19 shut-downs, we began expanding this work in Bali. Even as this past year slowed this progress, we continued planning how to establish these partnerships. Now, we are reinvigorating our law enforcement conferencing and connections in earnest.



Since 2012, we have served women and children living in a 17-acre cemetery in East Java, Indonesia. Many of these women are victims of abuse, sexual exploitation, and trafficking. All of their situations are informed by severe poverty.

The children in this community are extremely vulnerable to trafficking. We operate two community centers on cemetery grounds run by Indonesian staff and volunteers to support these children's education and safety.

A Gear of Intention

Education

We opened our centers to serve vulnerable students while following Covid guidelines. They received tutoring, used computers for homework, took voice and art lessons, and even submitted poetry to a national contest! As restrictions eased, staff opened small classes and brought in virtual lecturers from all over the country.

Birthday Gifts

Early on in 2020, staff decided to bring birthday gifts to each child in the cemetery communities during quarantine, reminding them that they were not forgotten in a time when much felt uncertain. Each child received a personalized present or treat to express how loved and valuable they are.






600 FAMILIES SERVED our friends could not come to us SO WE WENT TO THEM


