LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

WHERE WE WORK

Indonesia is the fourth most populous country in the world and includes more than 17,000 islands. 6,000 of which are inhabited. It is also one of the largest child sex tourism destinations in the world. We are one of only a few anti-trafficking organizations operating within the country.

East Java

Our child and family sponsorship programs support two precious communities in East Java where children are at a high risk of being trafficked. Grace House, our second aftercare shelter, is also in this region.

West Java

West Java is home to the megacity and capital of Indonesia, Jakarta. We are building government relationships to facilitate the sustainable reduction of trafficking in this region. Our third aftercare home (not yet named) is also in this region.

North Sulawesi

Sarah's House is our shelter for trafficking survivors in North Sulawesi. The shelter, combined with law enforcement partnerships, has sustainably reduced trafficking in this region.



Bali

Bali is an international child sex tourism destination. We partner with other organizations in Bali to support law enforcement, caregivers, and partnered rescues.

WHAT WE DO

Personalized, Trauma-Informed Care

We provide personalized care for child survivors of sex trafficking. building resilience to overcome trauma through education, medical care, counseling, & life-skills training.

IMPACT STORY

In 2022, we served 19 girls in our residential aftercare program and five girls through community-based care. We were overjoyed to have six new intakes and to have two girls graduate from our aftercare program.. Throughout the year, our amazing care team staff worked extremely hard implementing new revisions to our care program, which prioritizes empowering a girl to develop and achieve her own personal dream goal, transitioning her back into the community sooner, and supporting her through community-based care. Another area of focus in 2022 was working towards opening our newest aftercare shelter in West Java! We hired and trained staff, remodeled the facility, and purchased furniture and supplies to open our doors in January of 2023.

Sarah's House was honored to receive a personal visit from Bintang Puspayoga, the Minister of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection of Indonesia. We believe this meeting will open doors for increased partnerships on a national level and are hopeful that this visit also signals that the central government of Indonesia sees anti-trafficking in Indonesia as a national priority.

When girls in our care are asked to testify against their trafficker. we provide a legal team and staff to advocate for her in a safe court environment.

IMPACT STORY

Legal Advocacy continues to be an important part of CF Aftercare. In 2022, five cases went to trial. CF Lawyers, Counselors, and Case Coordinators spent many weeks preparing each girl for what to expect in the courtroom, finishing with a mock trial. This preparation process impacts each girl differently, and counselors are particularly attuned to any signs of triggering a trauma memory. Of the five cases that went to trial in 2022, one case ended in a conviction, one was dropped due to lack of evidence and the remaining three are currently in court sessions.

We collaborate with local law enforcement by providing funding for legal rescues and case management for police, families, and rescued girls.

IMPACT STORY

2022 brought about expansion into a new and exciting area of work for Compassion First: Transit Monitoring. This process utilizes a trained team of workers who work at the seaport, identifying girls who are actively being trafficked. The team's goal is to "intercept" the girl before the trafficking process and stop the trafficker before they can take a girl from her home island to a place of exploitation.

When CF staff, who are embedded into transit stations, have good reason to believe that someone is at substantial risk of being trafficked, they will intercept them using the step-by-step protocol developed by our project partner Love Justice International (LJI). These traffic intercepts are a great prevention strategy. The team is not only preventing girls from being trafficked, but they are also helping the police to identify the trafficker, further improving our teamwork with the local police departments. For each trafficker who is arrested and processed legally, many girls will be spared future recruitment by the trafficker. In 2022 we made a total of **41 intercepts**!

WHAT WE DO (CONT.)

Prevention through Community Development

Through educational sponsorships, entrepreneurial opportunities, and community classes, we prevent vulnerable children from being trafficked.

IMPACT STORY

2022 was a fun year of reconnecting and rebuilding in our Community Development programs following the pandemic. In both the Yellow Flower and Rose Communities, we started hosting individualized tutoring for 70 children and started SMART kids classes. We also hosted gatherings twice a month for about 15-20 teens and pre-teens in both communities to connect to share and explore important topics, including healthy relationships, communication, and Internet Safety.

In 2022 the women in the Rose Community asked to learn how to read, so our team showed up excited to do just that. Each class was filled with joy and laughter as the women excitedly began to learn. By request, the women also asked about learning to cook on a budget, and so we began facilitating cooking classes with the women.






We are asking God for more Indonesian staff to fill key positions throughout all our operations. Would you join us in that prayer?

WHERE WE ARE GOING IN 2023

2023 will be another year of expansion, with new opportunities in almost all areas of our work. Together with you and by the grace of God, we are embarking on the following new endeavors in 2023:

- Opening Sarah's House Dua (2), a second home for girls who are getting ready to integrate back into the community.
- Opening a CF Center in North Sulawesi to provide more girls in the community with resources such as entrepreneurship programs, tutoring, skills training, parenting classes, and counseling services.
- Re-establishing Grace House in East Java.
- Siting and formally opening an entrepreneurship center in East Java.
- Partnering with the National and provincial government for best practice training across multiple departments.

- Broad based prevention/education partnerships with churches and school systems.
- Finding three future transit monitoring locales with the hope of beginning operations.
- Beginning to host development events in Indonesia.
